1942-2022



Jim Duggan is remembered as a devoted, humble, and pioneering criminal defense attorney. As a professor and interim dean at Franklin Pierce Law Center, Jim inspired countless students. He founded the Public Defender Office in Manchester, led its statewide expansion, and served as New Hampshire’s first chief appellate defender. His legacy continued as an associate justice on the New Hampshire Supreme Court.

To honor his memory, the UNH Franklin Pierce School of Law has established the **Professor**
