


INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

PRACTICE-BASED OPPORTUNITIES

Intellectual Property & Transaction Clinic

The Intellectual Property and Transaction Clinic provides the opportunity for real-world experience in a live-client setting. Students conduct interviews, research and draft documents, and advise clients in a variety of intellectual property and transactional matters.

Clinic clients include authors, artists, musicians, publishers, and individuals operating small businesses; or nonprofit organizations with issues pertaining to copyright and trademark registration and protection, licensing, small business transactions, as well as assistance forming and managing nonprofit corporations. The clinic assists clients with both adversarial matters (pre-litigation IP disputes and litigation/Trademark Trial and Appeal Board proceedings) and non-adversarial matters (trademark and copyright registrations, contracts, and counseling).

International Technology Transfer Institute

The International Technology Transfer Institute (ITTI) conducts research, scholarship, education, advocacy, and capacity building at the dynamic interface where intellectual property, innovation and global economic development converge. Collaborating with organizations such as WIPO, WHO, USPTO, the U.S. Department of Commerce, and the World Bank, ITTI assists countries, whether developing (Africa), emerging (S.E. Asia) or transitioning (former USSR) to accelerate knowledge-based, innovation-driven development.

UNH Law students taking part in ITTI are actively involved in its programs and projects, performing patent landscape analyses, forging international networks, formulating strategic plans, drafting reports, authoring publications, presenting at professional meetings, and engaging in detailed strategic discussions with key global organizations and colleagues.
